DISCERNING DIRECTION Board Visioning Retreat – May 17, 2007

Recently the Board of DFC held its first full-day visioning retreat on the grounds of the Crieff Hills Conference Centre (near Hwy 6, between Hamilton and Guelph). Free from the typical multi-item Board meeting agenda, we focused for an extended time on seeking the Spirit's leading for ongoing ministry in Canada. As an emerging ministry we reflected on forming realistic priorities as responsible stewards of the resources of people and time, while responding in faith and obedience to God's leading. Priority areas of our mission were identified as prayer, congregational renewal, and leadership development.

For congregational renewal we discerned that the Dunamis video courses lend themselves well to the Canadian context, in which the Alpha course has experienced much success. Alpha has a similar format and also introduces the person and work of the Holy Spirit, including addressing spiritual warfare and healing. The Dunamis video courses also allow us to come alongside many churches with a realistic investment of people and time on the part of DFC.



However, for this ministry to truly be a way of renewal working in and through churches, we need to raise up leaders to serve as facilitators and small group leaders for these courses who have experience with the Dunamis teaching and ministry model, and empowerment by the Holy Spirit. To provide this leadership development we have Burlington Dunamis Conferences. The major difference we envision is that the regional Dunamis Conferences will now encompass the first three topics and perhaps the traditional sixth as well (Gateways, In the Spirit's Power, Prayer, and Evangelism) as 1½ day weekend events, while the topics of Healing and Deliverance would typically be offered as the more intensive 4-5 day Dunamis Projects on a national level or for larger regions.

Video course facilitator and team training would then be available along the way to those participating in the Dunamis Conference track, or who themselves have been participants in video courses, as is presently the criteria.

Ignite!, a one day "taster" event in a local church will be made available in a limited way, primarily because of the investment of people and time it takes and the small pool of team leaders and members available to draw from at this time. We will weigh and pray through requests, interacting with churches regarding the best 'next steps' for them to take in seeking renewal through greater openness to and experience of the person and work of the Holy Spirit.

If you have provided leadership in any way (e.g. planning, teaching, facilitating, prayer ministry, intercession) for a Dunamis or other PRMI event in the past, we would appreciate the opportunity to connect with you and explore possible ministry opportunities that may fit your spiritual gifting, interests and time availability. Burlington Conference on Spiritual Warfare - March 2007

Tension exists between Christ's victory over darkness and the reality of Satan's kingdom earth. As Christians, Christ calls His followers to equip themselves for a spiritual battle that builds God's Kingdom on earth. The fifth Burlington Dunamis conference on *Spiritual Warfare* drew over 200 participants who were ready to be challenged, receive healing and become equipped for work in God's Kingdom.

In preparation for the conference the prayer ministry team and intercessors met on three occasions to pray for all aspects of the conference. They received training from Mary Ellen Connors and Cindy Strickler, both from PRMI. At the end of the sessions, some prayer teams found themselves with new partners in accordance with the Spirits leading.

The conference itself proved successful. Brad Long and Cindy Strickler of PRMI, taught portions of the eight full lessons over the weekend to give participants a taste of what is spiritual warfare. Prayer ministry throughout the conference responded to persons seeking healing from oppressive spirits and past hurts that have prohibited them from moving forward in Kingdom work. There was joy for many who experienced God's releasing power in their lives. In helping attendees gain a greater awareness of their role in God's Kingdom against darkness, many were also encouraged to continue learning and maturing in the area of Spiritual warfare.
